John H. Teel

is the National Science Foundation STEP Program Grant Manager at Eastfield College. Mr. Teel began serving in this position in August, 2009. He is a 32-year public servant in the local government field, specializing in public health and environmental protection.

Mr. Teel worked for the City of Garland Health Department for 28 years, retiring in 2006 as Director of Health. He has been a public health and municipal government consultant since 2006.

Mr. Teel began his educational path at Eastfield College in 1972, graduating with an A.S. in 1975. He then earned his Bachelor of Science in Zoology with a minor in Earth Science from Texas A&M – Commerce in 1976, followed by his Master of Science with a double major in Biology and Chemistry in 1979 (also from Texas A&M – Commerce).

Mr. Teel has authored or co-authored 12 articles in science journals, and in 2009 co-authored a public health best practices manual on pandemic influenza planning.

Mr. Teel is married to Deborah Teel and their daughter Lindsey is a junior at the University of North Texas (a proud graduate of Richland College). The Teel's reside in Rowlett.
