Dr. Stuart E. Ravnik currently serves as the Assistant Dean, Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. Prior to his appointment as Assistant Dean in 2002, he served as Associate Professor in the Department of Cell Biology and Biochemistry at Texas Tech University Health Science Center in Lubbock, Texas from 1995-2002.

Dr. Ravnik received the B.S. degree in Biology from the University of Washington in 1985 and the Ph. D in the Department of Biological Structure at the University of Washington in 1991. His Thesis advisor was Dr. Charles H. Muller, and his Thesis Title was titled: "The Role of Lipid Transfer Protein in Human Sperm Capacitation". He has completed Post-doctoral research at the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Columbia University, in New York (1991-1995) in cell cycle regulation in the mouse germ line and at the University of Washington School of Medicine in Seattle, Washington (1991) studying the role of estrogen and progesterone receptors in natural killer-like cells in the mouse uterus.

National recognitions, honors and awards include: the 1999 American Society of Andrology, Young Andrologist Award (Young Scientist of the Year); the American Society of Andrology, Student Merit Award, 15th Annual Meeting, Columbia, SC, April 1990; the American Society of Andrology, New Investigator Award, 13th Annual Meeting, Houston, TX, March 1988; NSF Graduate Fellowship, Honorable Mention 1986.

Current grant support include: the NIGMS, "Quantitative Sciences Summer Research Program", 04-01-05 to 3-31-2008 in the amount of \$328,684, S.E. Ravnik-Co-Principal Investigator and the HHMI, "Grants for Pre-College Science Education: The STARS Science Triathlon", 09-01-07 to 8-31-12 in the amount of \$750,000, Co-Principal Investigator. Dr. Ravnik is married to Terri L.P. Ravnik and is the proud father of two children.
