### GUIDED PATHWAY: ANTHROPOLOGY

The guided pathway in Anthropology combines Anthropology courses with core courses to complete the associate degree. An Associate of Arts degree in this pathway prepares you to transfer to a university to earn a bachelor's degree that opens the door to careers such as Cultural and Environmental Resource Management, Medical Anthropology and Public Health, Urban Planning, Forensics, and many others.

This is an example course sequence for students interested in Anthropology. It does not represent a contract, nor does it guarantee course availability. Following this pathway will help you earn an AA degree<sup>2</sup>, which will increase your chances of transfer to bachelor's-level programs. Courses that complete the Degree (D) are noted below.
